Registration Times:

12:00p.m. – Registration Opens 5:00p.m. – Registration Closes. *5:30p.m. – Mandatory briefing*

No Teams are allowed on the water and ALL practice MUST cease at 12 noon the day of registration, until the tournament begins.

Fish Limits

Largemouth & Smallmouth bass 14" inches and over.

Anglers are allowed to weigh a limit of three (3) fish per team unless otherwise required by law or tournament officials.

Fish presented which fails to measure the official length limits shall accrue penalties at the rate of one (1) pound for each non-legal fish plus loss of the fish. An 8-ounce deduction will be made for each fish presented that is determined to be non-releasable.

Required Items and Safety Equipment

It is the responsibility of participants to have ALL required state and federal safety equipment on board and ALL permits, licenses, passes or stamps, required.

At time of inspection each morning, be prepared to display 1 life jacket for each angler; 1 throwable PFD; and, demonstrate functioning kill switch.

Inspection will be held during lineup for takeoff. Live wells must be empty.

Anglers 16 years old or older, (over 15 in Iowa <u>only</u> waters) are required to have a valid fishing license/ permit, if applicable by law.

Boundaries

Mississippi River pools 7, 8, 9 LOCK AT YOUR OWN RISK, Launch in pool 8.

Any waters within these boundaries posted "off limits" or "no fishing" by state or federal agencies will be off limits. Any live release areas established by the Tournament Director or announced at the pre-tournament briefing will be off limits. Only that water open to all public fishing will be considered tournament waters. Any waters closed to public fishing will be closed to this tournament's contestants. All local, state and federal regulations apply.

If you go outside these defined river boundaries completely into another state's waters you may need those states fishing license as well.
